

Olmsted Historical Society

The Society was founded in 1953 and was incorporated as a non-profit in 1961. The Society, which is a membership organization open to the public, took on the challenge of preserving the history of the area and in 1969 it became the organization known today as the Olmsted Historical Society. The Frostville Museum arose out of the Society's mission of Preserving the Past and the Present for the Future.

Frostville is a 19th century village museum depicting lives of the early settlers in our area. Our village of 15 buildings, many of which are original 1800's construction, is in the Cleveland Metroparks/Rocky River Reservation at 24101 Cedar Point Road (Corner of Cedar Point and Lewis Roads).

The Olmsted Historical Society sponsors many events throughout the year such as Teas featuring living historian reenactors; Pumpkinville in September; Holidays at Frostville; Skeletonville during October; Car and Engine shows and weekly Farmers Markets and Trash and Treasure Sales. We encourage you and your family to come visit Frostville, the little gem in the valley.

Our dedicated volunteers provide many hours of service helping with community events; promoting historical preservation and participating in our local school's educational programs.
